

UTC Lancashire Pupil Premium Activity for the 2015/16 Financial Year

For the 2015/16 financial year, we received funding for each learner registered as eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years.

For each of these disadvantaged learners we received £935 to aid additional support to assist these learners to achieve.

Eligibility for free school meals is the main measure of deprivation at pupil level.

There is also funding available in the sum of £1,900 for each looked-after pupil who:

- has been looked after for 1 day or more
- was adopted from care on or after 30 December 2005, or left care under:
 - a special guardianship order
 - a residence order

There are currently no looked-after pupils in the college.

For 2015/16 financial year we were awarded £15895 of funding.

In total for the year we provided interventions that were 25% in excess of the value of the funding we received.

This was used to fund a number of activities within college including:

Enriching site visits to engineering and construction relevant locations

One to one mentoring.

One to one class room support.

An accelerated reading programme for targeted individuals.

A targeted Streets Mentoring Programme aimed at building self-confidence and self-discipline.

Social skills enrichment including teamwork/confidence building interventions.

CAT tests to enable more personalised learning programmes to be developed.

Careers Information Advice and Guidance for post-16 options including: input from a local training provider who can provide advice and guidance towards applying for apprenticeships.

Input from our university sponsors to encourage more able learners to aim higher towards Higher Education.

For the learners who were eligible for pupil premium at the end of the financial and financial year to 5th April 2016, without exception we saw positive impact for the interventions we have provided.

Of the learners in the pupil premium cohort 63% have increased their attitude to learning ranking.

44% have increased their attendance.

52% of all pupil premium pupils have attendance above 94%

48% of all pupil premium pupils have attendance about 95%

100% of pupils have increased their grades in 3 subject areas.

63% of pupils have increased their grades in 4 subject areas

13% of learners has increased grades in 5 subject areas.
